1. What did some people (likely parents) want Jesus to do (v. 13a)?
2. How did the disciples react to this (v. 13b)?
3. What was Jesus' attitude regarding these requests (v. 14a)?
4. What lesson did Jesus teach from this incident (v. 14b)?
5. Who came to Jesus after this?
6. What did this person want to know (v. 16)?
7. What was Jesus' answer (vv. 17b-19)?
8. What was the man's response to Jesus' reply (v. 20)?
9. What did Jesus then tell the man to do (v. 21)?
10. How did the man react to what Jesus told him? Why (v. 22)?
11. If you are a parent of infants or young children, how do you view Jesus' concern for your children?
12. Do you believe that parents in the New Covenant have the same promise that God gave to Abraham in Genesis 17 that He will be not only your God but your children's God? Why or why not? If so, how do you claim this promise?
13. Why do you think Jesus told the rich young man to keep the commandments in order to inherit eternal life? Does this mean salvation by works is possible?
14. Why do you think the rich young man thought he had kept God's requirements? Why do you suppose he then thought he still lacked eternal life?
15. How does the incident with the children who were brought to Jesus and the attitude of the disciples contrast with the episode with the rich young man?
16. How do many in the Church view those who are socially insignificant compared with those who have social status (see James 2:1-7)?

19. Does Jesus expect everyone who follows Him to sell everything they have and give it to the poor? Why or why not?
20. Are we to keep God's commandments? If so, which ones?
21. How do we know that our efforts to keep God's requirements are not able to obtain eternal life? How do we obtain eternal life?

Announcement:

All are invited to the Lord's Table who have been baptized, have publicly professed faith in (either before a congregation of the Lord's Church or to a body of Elders in a church where the Gospel of Christ is embraced) and allegiance to the Lord Jesus Christ as the Savior from your sins, and are members of the visible Church of the Lord Jesus Christ.

If you have not publicly professed faith in Christ Jesus – the eternal Son of God who took on human flesh, lived a perfect, sinless life, died on the cross for sins, rose bodily from the dead, and who is returning to this earth in power and glory – please refrain from partaking of the Lord's Table.

We invite you to respond to the Gospel by first understanding that you have sinned personally against the God who made you and have violated His good and right laws for you to follow. God is holy and has every right to separate you from Himself and from all that is good and beautiful because of your freely chosen disobedience to Him. But the really good news is that you can be restored to the God who made you because of what Christ Jesus has done on the cross as a perfect substitute and payment for the penalty that you owe and deserve. Simply believing and trusting in what Jesus did for you means you will belong to the LORD God forever.

Abraham, the Biblical example of one who was restored to God by faith alone, trusted God's promise and the LORD God credited it, that trust, to him as righteousness. God has shown His love to the world, and to you, by giving His only Son that whoever believes in Him should not die and be separated from Him forever but rather have the life man was created to have in the presence of God, a life that never ends.

This means that you cannot DO anything to earn your place with God. However, a true faith in Christ Jesus comes from a God-given desire that will produce behavior that does those things that are pleasing to Him.

Please seek out and contact one of our Pastors or Elders to talk

more about your eternal future. You can find their contact information in this bulletin. They will be glad to show you from Scripture, God's Word, how you can have a relationship with God through Christ Jesus and have true peace and security with Him.

If you have professed faith in Christ Jesus, have been baptized, and are a member of the Church, yet there is a distance between you and the LORD because of cherished and unrepentant sin and transgressions of God's laws, we warn you to refrain from partaking the elements of the Lord's Table today. Scripture tells us that partaking of the Lord's Table is a participation, a communion, in the body and blood of Christ (1 Cor. 10:16). God's people cannot partake of His holy Table while at the same time engaging in deliberate and conscious violations of His commands for us as His holy people. If this is true with you, the LORD graciously promises that, if you confess and turn from whatever thinking or behavior that is contrary to His nature and His Word, He is faithful to forgive and to cleanse you from all unrighteousness (1 John 1:9). Until you have confessed and turned from whatever this breach of faith might be, please refrain from partaking of the Lord's Table.

This does not mean that as a professing follower of Christ you are required to be perfect and flawless before communing with Christ at His Table. The Table is for you to be nourished and strengthened even more in your faith and love for Christ. You may have worries and doubts that God loves or hears you because your faith is weak. You may have sinned, confessed, and turned from it to the Lord before partaking, but still your heart condemns you. When you come to the Lord's Table, the Lord by faith assures you that you belong to Him, and He belongs to you. If, despite your sins and imperfections, you can truly say that the LORD is your Shepherd, that the name of Christ and His smile is the desire of your soul, then take the LORD at His word that you are ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven!

Come, and dine with your Lord and Savior.

CONFESSION OF SIN

Lord of mercy and grace, we confess that our love for You waxes cold and our hearts grow indifferent to Your holy Word. We are quick to blame others and to excuse our own faults and shortcomings.

Produce in us the fruits of righteousness and holiness to the glory of Your Name: Through Jesus Christ our Lord, Whose righteousness is our glorious clothing. Amen.
