## 14 April 2024 – Questions to Discuss and Consider at Home or in Small Group "Trying to Make Sense of the Spirituality of the Church" -- John 18:33-38; Luke 12:13-14; Mark 6:14-20

Questions to Answer from the Text

- 1. What question did Pilate ask Jesus (John 18:33)?
- 2. What did Jesus tell Pilate about His Kingdom (John 18:36)?
- 3. Why did Jesus come into the world (John 18:37a)?
- 4. Who are those who listen to Jesus (John 18:37b)?
- 5. What task did someone ask Jesus to do (Luke 12:13)?
- 6. How did Jesus respond to this person who asked Him to do this (Luke 12:14)?
- 7. What did John the Baptist say to King Herod that got him into trouble (Mark 6:18)?
- 8. Who was upset because John said this to King Herod (Mark 6:19a)?
- 9. What did this person who was upset with John want to do to him (Mark 6:19b)?
- 10. How did King Herod treat John (Mark 6:20)?

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

- 11. What would you offer as a simple definition of "The Spirituality of the Church"?
- 12. What does the *Westminster Confession of Faith* teach about the spirituality of the Church? [See *WCF* 25.1, 3; 31.4]
- 13. Because the Church's mission is to proclaim and teach the Gospel, does this mean that it must be silent about any and all matters that involve the civic sphere?
- 14. What would you consider an extraordinary exception to *WCF* 31.4 wherein the Church would petition the magistrate pertaining to a particular matter? Would you agree or disagree with T. David Gordon's position regarding a proposed overture to the magistrate? - 15. How have various denominations and/or churches improperly inserted themselves in the affairs of the civil magistrate?
- 16. What are ways, other than voting, that Christian citizens might get involved in the civic realm to advance truth and the cause of righteousness?
- 17. When denominations or churches promote political activism, whether from the political left, right, or center, is the church diminished, enhanced, or neither?

- 18. Are individual Christians immune from spiritual and ecclesiastical accountability in the exercise of their political rights and actions?
- 19. How should a particular congregation react and respond to the cultural deviations from God's creational designs when such deviations become political issues?
- 20. Is the proclamation of the Gospel, teaching what Christ commanded, and administering the sacraments sufficient means to impact the civic realm? Why or why not?
