

**April 6, 2025 – Questions to Discuss and Consider at Home or in Small Group**  
**“Moses Was Always Where He Needed to Be” -- Exodus 2:23-3:10**

Questions to Answer from the Text:

1. What was the condition of Israel after the king of Egypt died (2:23a)?
2. What did the people do when they were in this condition (2:23b)?
3. What four descriptions does the text give for how the LORD reacted to Israel's condition (2:24-25)?
4. What was Moses doing at this specific time? Where was he? (3:1)?
5. What did Moses see that grabbed his attention? How did he respond (3:2-3)?
6. Who spoke to Moses? Where was He? What was Moses told to do? Why (3:4-6)?
7. How did Moses respond to this (3:6b)?
8. What did the LORD tell Moses He would do (3:7-8a)?
9. Where was the LORD God going to take the Israelites (3:8b)?
10. Where did God tell Moses to go? For what purpose (3:9-10)?

Questions for Reflection and Discussion:

11. Is there a relationship between worship and service? If so, what?
12. How has spending time in the LORD's presence prepared you for service in His Kingdom?
13. What does “holiness” mean?
14. What makes something “holy”?
15. Is the church building holy? Why or why not?
16. At what point in life is a Christian no longer useful for service in the LORD's Church?
17. Who were some older persons in Scripture whom God used to do His will?
18. Who were some young people in the Bible whom God used in His service.
19. What do you think is the hardest aspect of suffering or going through rough and difficult times in life?
20. Why do many Christians struggle to believe that God cares during times of prolonged hardships?
21. How do you know that God sees and cares about you when you are suffering or in a dry spell in your Christian walk?
22. What concrete steps can you take when you feel distant from the LORD or disconnected during times of hardship or periods of low spiritual motivation?
