Questions for Younger Ones (ages 5-18) to Answer from the Text:

1. What were the Israelites never to do (v. 28)?
2. What does it mean to “revile” (v. 28a)?
3. What were the Israelites to be prompt in doing (v. 29a)?
4. What special offerings were the Israelites to give to the LORD (v. 29b-30a)?
5. When was an ox or a sheep to be given to the LORD (v. 30b)?
6. What kind of people were the Israelites to be (v. 31a)?
7. What were the Jews not allowed to eat (v. 31b)?
8. What were they to do with this food instead (v. 31c)?

Questions for Reflection and Discussion:

9. In your opinion, in what shape is the fabric that holds American society together? Your church? Your family?
10. In your estimation, is authority in the nation, in the church, and in the home respected and honored as you think it should be?
11. How can those in authority reclaim and/or ensure that their leadership will be accorded respect?
12. As a member of the Church of the Lord Jesus Christ, what does the Lord want you to give to Him on a regular basis?
13. How should you measure your consecration to God?
14. What does “firstborn” signify?
15. What is the spiritual significance of the “eighth day” in Scripture?
16. In what sense might the regulation against eating what has been torn by wild beasts (23:31b) point to the Gospel?
